OLD BUSINESS

2

*Barbara North attended the March Presbytery Meeting at Highland Presbyterian Church in Winston Salem and reported that a motion was made from Trinity Presbyterian Church asking Salem Presbytery to concur with OVT-006, which directs the Board of Pensions and the Presbyterian Church (USA) Foundation to divest from fossil fuel and actively invest in securities that focus on renewable energy. The overture requesting this course of action will be brought to the 223rd General Assembly in June 2018. Salem Presbytery supported this effort by concurring with the overture.

*Mark Sandlin reported the Safety Committee had met. The bushes and hedges next to the church have been trimmed back. Signs saying "No Trespassing From 12:00am—7:00am" will be placed around the building at locations recommended by the Police Department. We will also place boxes near the front steps containing literature on where to find housing, food, and assistance from the city, local churches and relief agencies. New video cameras are planned for the building exterior and the committee will meet with Gateway to coordinate.

City Council to Honor Marty Sheets



At the Greensboro City Council meeting on Tuesday, April 3rd at 5:30pm, Marty Sheets will be honored with a resolution honoring his life of service to promote education and awareness of people with disabilities, as well as fundraising for Special Olympics and other nonprofits. Marty was selected to participate in the first Special Olympics in 1968 and was awarded a gold medal at the games by the organization's founder, Eunice Kennedy Shriver. The public is welcome to attend this meeting, and the Sheets family would appreciate it. The City Council meets in the Council Chamber at the Melvin Municipal Office, 300 W. Washington St. A lifelong resident of Greensboro, Marty will be further honored by the installation of honorary sign toppers saying "Marty Sheets Way" at the intersection of Pamlico and DeSoto Place, with an unveiling ceremony on Saturday, April 28th (the time has not yet been announced).

Covenant in Mission

Covenant is in ministry to the community through the use of the building. Built for a large Sunday School and Youth program in the heyday of the church, space is now being shared and used in a variety of ways. Seven recovery groups, focusing primarily on AA or NA issues, reach several scores of individuals each week. These have a variety of early morning, day and evening schedules. Kate Baird does a good job in juggling their arrangements to accommodate changing group sizes and needs. Twelve or more artists and musicians maintain studios or workspaces on the second and third floors. These include Covenant members Lora Farlow, Beth Sheffield, and Susan Reep, and musicians Scott Manring and Neill Clegg. Our two largest and most prominent tenants are the weekday After Gateway program for physically-challenged adults, and the Sunday meeting of the Greensboro Mennonite Fellowship. Thriving at Three, an outreach program of UNCG's Center for New North Carolinians, meets every Thursday morning for half a day; four Covenant members volunteer with the group. Covenant also welcomes various community groups, including the College Hill Neighborhood Association, the Piedmont Plateau Group Sierra Club, The ARC of Greensboro, three yoga classes, a Pilates group, and three meditation groups, including Covenant's In*Spire Group meeting Tuesdays at noon in the Sanctuary. Covenant is engaged in the community in more ways than some members realize! Our financial support to the church makes these things happen, and their rent payments help keep the church going.
