The church has created a Long-Range Planning Committee under the direction of Nancy Schaefer and Tom Taylor, Resource Committee Session members. The community members of the committee are: David Johnson, Charlene Holler, Lora Farlow, Judy Lockhart, Gratia Wright, and Jim North.

The Session reauthorized the subcommittee of the Building Committee, consisting of Elsie Hutchens, Ralph Cauthen and George Lockhart (committee chair) to negotiate with After Gateway for additional space and to also renegotiate the new long-term lease with After Gateway.

The Presbytery has developed some new Child Protection Policies for people who work with your youth. Personnel Committee will manage applying these policies to our church. The Peace and Justice Task Force of the Presbytery has endorsed Black Lives Matter and has committed resources to increase anti-racism awareness and work in Salem Presbytery.

We are pleased to have a new convenient freezer in the kitchen, donated by Vance Arnold. Thank you, Vance!

Finalizing loan papers was taking place at the time of the Session meeting. Since that time the loan has been approved and the work has begun to install the two new boilers for the church. We should have heat by the time the weather turns cold!

## Spring Lake PCoC Assistance

The 110-year-old (1909) Presbyterian Church of the Covenant in Spring Lake, NC, was devastated after Hurricane Florence. The Lower Little River at the back of their property flooded the sanctuary, the fellowship hall and the office/library with 6 feet of polluted water, and the church must be restored and all contents replaced. The PCoC to PCoC Initiative will help this church rebuild. We are holding a fund-raising drive through October to assist. All contributions will go directly to the church itself. # November Food Drive for Mary's House

PCoC will hold a canned food drive during the first three weeks of November to benefit Mary's House, a local faith-based ministry providing transitional and permanent housing, life skills training, and a supportive community for homeless women in recovery from substance abuse. A donation box will be available at the back of the Sanctuary to fill with your contributions of canned or dried goods, which will be donated to the residents in time for Thanksgiving and the holiday season.



Mary's House provides in-house substance abuse counseling, case management and parenting skills training to all residents. They also provide in-house children's groups to help the youngest residents start out their lives without the burden of an addicted family member. The program is one of the few in the United States that allows women to raise their children while in treatment for addiction issues. The local home has eight bedrooms and six baths, which can house up to eight families at a time. The program is fully licensed by the North Carolina Division of Facility Services.
