Session Meeting Minutes, December 17, 2018

Old Business

The Elder Nominating Committee has formulated a slate to present to the Congregation for a vote. The date for the congregational meeting will be January 6, 2019, at 10:00am in the Sanctuary.

George Lockhart is still negotiating the lease for After Gateway. Utility costs have significantly increased since the lease began, so this expense will be considered.

Barbara North and Joyce Powers are getting the furniture needed for the Pastor's office, which is being re-located to the second floor.

Resource

The Session has decided to purchase the office copier, rather than renewing the lease for five years at a significantly higher cost.

The autumn Stewardship campaign was successful; units are fewer, but pledges are higher.

The Capital Campaign for the repayment of the loan for the Boiler replacement and repair is planned for February 2019 and the 24th is a possibility since there is already a joint service and meal scheduled for that day.

Resource presented a 2019 Balanced Budget.

Resource presented our contract workers with gift certificates for Christmas.

We have reviewed the new Child Protection Policy from Salem Presbytery and are adding changes to our Human Resource Manual and implementing them.


Ten people were served this month by our Congregational Care volunteers.


