Session Meeting Minutes, February 12, 2019

We are still attempting to obtain a new snow removal service provider for clearing our parking lots; our former provider has retired.

Nancy Schaefer was elected as PCoC Treasurer for 2019. Annie Oakley was elected as PCoC Clerk for 2019.

The Session approved the 2018 Statistical Report, which has been submitted to Salem Presbytery.

The Session approved the changes to our Human Resources manual and to our employment application, as requested by Salem Presbytery.

A lot of progress has been made in moving the music from the old Music Room on the third floor to the new Music Room on the second floor (room 206). After going through over 70 years' worth of music, what will no longer be used will be donated to UNCG's music library. \$250 was spent to move the heavy furniture.

The Resource Committee reports that we are still under budget. While giving has slowed, revenues from sales of parking passes have exceeded expectations. Expenses were under budget, except for building expenses due to moving of classrooms and the pastor's office, and repairs to the building. These expenditures put us over budget by \$700.

Lem Cox is presently researching candidates to repair the pews in the Sanctuary.

The Building & Grounds Committee has requested approximately \$750 to replace damaged flooring in an After Gateway classroom.

The Congregational Care report for January: Four providers served nine individuals. Jane Cauthen visited, called, and consulted with Charlene Holler to nine members.

## **PNC Update**

The PNC is working to schedule meetings between PCoC, the Salem Presbytery Commission on Ministry and the candidates under consideration. This is the next step on our journey to select a candidate.

## PCoC 2019 Capital Campaign Kicks Off!

The lunch to celebrate the beginning of the 2019 Capital Campaign was a huge success. Members enjoyed the hot lunch prepared by Joy Saleeby, Joyce Powers, Charlene Holler, and Cathy Routley, consisting of beef tips, mashed potatoes and gravy, green beans, and hot apple crisp for dessert. Session members served beverages and desserts. Julie Strope put together beautiful spring flowers as table decorations.

A Capital Campaign is needed to raise funds to reduce the principal on the loan from the Presbyterian Investment and Loan Program that was awarded in December, 2018. The church borrowed \$30,000 from the PILP and was also awarded a grant of \$10,000. These amounts helped pay for the installation of the new heating system which has been keeping us warm this winter. The first \$5,000 received from the Capital Campaign will be used to pay down the debt. The rest of the amount pledged will be split equally between debt reduction and other improvements. George Lockhart, resource committee member, announced that \$10,000 is already pledged for the capital campaign, of which \$5,000 is a "matching" gift. If pledges are made as part of a gift of \$5,000, a "matching gift" will increase the amount to \$10,000!

After a slide show by Mitch Fore depicting some possible repair projects, Tom Taylor encouraged members and attendees to think about other work they wanted to see done to the church's property. These ideas were collected on a bulletin board and will be reviewed by the Resource Committee and the Session. Pledge "cards" were handed out and those interested in contributing were asked to bring their pledges on Sunday, March 17<sup>th</sup>, when a short service of "thanksgiving" will be held. Pledges can also be mailed to the church office or added to the Sunday offering basket. For those who were not able to attend the lunch or do not have one, a copy of the pledge form is available on the back table in the Sanctuary or in the church office.
