Session Meeting Minutes, April 9, 2019

The Session plans a retreat in July to set goals for 2020. One discussion topic will be ways to let the greater community know who Covenant is, in hopes of increasing our attendance.

The Installation of Mark Sandlin as PCoC's called pastor will be on June 23, 2019, at 2:00 pm. Diana Butler Bass has accepted an invitation to speak at Mark's installation. She is well known for her progressive writing and work.

The PCoC PNC and Session will attend the May14th Presbytery meeting to present Mark Sandlin to the Presbytery as our Installed Pastor.

The Resource Committee presented the March financial report (see page 3) and distributed copies of the prioritized list for the Capital Repairs, which identified six areas of focus: repairs to roof leaks; interior painting in stairwells; replacement of carpet on stairs/entryway to the Sanctuary; outside banner project; courtyard improvement by the office entrance; security cameras.

Ann Finch requested we buy a defibrillator; the \$1,500 purchase price is not in the 2019 budget, but we will continue to pursue this purchase.

The Worship Committee reports that the Bell and Chancel choirs will recess for the summer.

We have no teacher for the children's class and no nursery attendant. We will seek new personnel for the fall. Guidelines will be established regarding the eligibility ages for the nursery. Due to misuse, the Session has decided the Nursery will be locked when there is no supervisor present.

Our thanks to Nancy Schaefer for adding the chair rail in the parlor. Our thanks to Barbara North for cleaning of and refurbishing of the second and third floor bathrooms.

Anne Finch and Mark Sandlin met concerning outreaches. PCoC wants to make a difference in the world and plans are underway to make this happen. One new effort is titled, "When We Eat, They Eat": an ongoing food drive every time there's a meal served at PCoC, such as the Wednesday Night Fellowship Suppers, meals after Joint Services, and also on Communion Sundays (the first Sunday of each month).

The Communications Committee has met and is in the initial stages of making plans to let the outside community know who we are. The Session also emphasized to committees the need for stronger communication with each other and the Session and the church office, to facilitate event planning and meetings schedules.

Congregational Care: Five providers serviced six individuals; Jane Cauthen served six people by making visits and calls.

Capital Campaign Update

Through the end of March, 2019, amounts pledged to our Capital Campaign total \$45,150 for both 2019 and 2020. As intended, \$5,000 of this will be paid in the coming weeks to reduce the principal balance on the loan the church took on to pay for the new heating system. The remaining pledged balance of \$40,150 will be split 50/50 to pay for capital improvements and debt reduction, when the funds are received. The loan balance as of March 31, 2019, is \$28,687.92, so the church will be well on its way to being debt-free within twelve months.

When the pledged amounts are received, there will be funds available for improvement projects of approximately \$20,000. The Resource and Building Committees are in the process of putting together a list of possible projects and determining their estimated costs, and will report to the Session as soon as possible.
