Session Meeting Minutes, December 10, 2020

The Elder Nominating Committee reported we have several potential candidates to serve as new elders. The committee is moving forward to form a slate for a congregational vote in January.

Resource reports that as of the end of November, we are \$13,000 in the red. A request will be made that members bring their pledges up to date before the end of the year. At this point we have received \$31,850 for the capital campaign, which includes some 2020 pledges. Resource presented an unbalanced budget for 2020 for Session to approve. We are having a good pledge year of over \$100,000 which is the most we've had in several years, but an active church needs money to operate and we are still under the 2020 budget by \$16,000.

With Mark Cable stepping down from opening and closing of the church each Sunday, as well as sound engineer, we will use volunteers during January to open and close the church, as well as setting up/tearing down sound equipment, managing the sound board during services, and making voice recordings of the messages from each service.

Outreach reported that Covenant is on its way to becoming a Hunger Action Church in 2020. Outreach will also put flyers on the back table about the Mullen Forum to be held at Mt. Tabor First Presbyterian Church on February 22, 2020.

Outreach also recommended that PCoC make donations: \$500 to People to People Liaison, \$250 to the IRC, \$1,200 to After Gateway, \$400 to Thriving at Three, and \$50 to More Light Presbyterians.

To accommodate After Gateway's request for additional space for a private office for their Executive Director, it has been recommended that the Church Office be relocated to Marty's Room, which will be designated Marty's Room/Church Office.

The quotes are in for the ice and snow removal for this winter and Building and Grounds will make a decision on hiring a contractor.

Interior is still working on sprucing up the courtyard to the office. Two trees have already been added to the entrance.
