Dear PCoC Family,

I couldn't be more excited about our service on May 16. We will finally be gathering together in person for the first time in over a year!

The COVID Response Team has recommended to your Session that we begin meeting outdoors for the foreseeable future. The first outdoors service will take place on Sunday, May 16th, at 11:00am. We will gather in the parking lot on Morehead Ave. outside of After Gateway's entrance. Social distancing and masks will be required, and the COVID Team will have marked the pavement to indicate physicallydistanced seating. Please bring a chair to sit on. We will be taking temperatures as folks arrive (touchless, of course) and ask that, on any given Sunday, if you aren't feeling well, please refrain from attending. You can always join us online for that week, as we will continue to livestream the services, as well as have them available on Facebook and YouTube.

The format of the Sunday gathering will be much like it currently is online. We will have a Welcome, Scripture Reading, Music, the Message, Prayer, more Music, and a Closing. The hope is to give us a reasonably full worship experience while also not having us gather in large groups of at-risk people for too extended a time. We expect the service to last about 30 minutes for the time being.

I'd also like to thank you in advance for your patience at the first few gatherings as we work out any issues that may pop up. Not only will we be using an outside venue for the first time in guite a while, but I'll also be making use of technology in ways that I haven't needed to in the past. It'll all be tested ahead of time, but if there is one thing I've learned in the past year, it is to expected some unexpected things to happen.

Worship: Will continue online for now; Mark said there are usually 5-10K watchers when he starts his Sunday remark; can't tell how many are local, but will try to have information on this in May.

Spiritual Formation: Sunday morning Study group class is ongoing.

<u>Strategic Plan 2021 Workplan Development:</u> Using the Workplan to track progress on building maintenance. We have found someone to cut grass by the hour.

Interior

<u>Decluttering the church</u>: Barbara and the volunteers working on this have made tremendous progress, to be continued on monthly workdays.

Outreach: Anchor Hope Home is unable to receive the second delivery of backpacks/duffle bags. Ann will write a thank you note to Reconsidered Goods for their donations of them. Nancy presented a summary of the Hunger Action Congregation requirements. This was in the April newsletter, along with a call for volunteers who want to serve on a Hunger Action Team. We have inquired about involvement in the Guilford Food Council and the Greensboro Community Task Force. The next meeting of the task force is 5/11/21 by Zoom. Charlie spoke with Ann Comfort of the Outreach Committee at Westminster Presbyterian, who invited PCOC to join Westminster on Fridays (3-5 PM) to package food for the Out of the Garden project. Nancy and Charlie will meet before the April Outreach meeting to discuss the next steps for this team. The Small Wonders scholarship program is tabled until the summer. The Happy Meals Fund will continue to receive donations through April. Crescent Rotary of Greensboro will donate \$100-\$300 to the Spartan Open Pantry, thanks to Charlie's lobbying efforts.

Personnel: Congregational Care in March included contacts with members and attendees. The Cauthens and Lem Cox attended long-time member Bob Rayle's graveside service in High Point on March 23rd. Lem spoke for the church, expressing appreciation for Bob's life, character, and service to Covenant. Jane shared that in her enjoyable visits with him he always offered a meaningful prayer.

Monthly Work Day Minutes and Reminder

Thanks to the hard work of our wonderful volunteers, lots was accomplished at the April Work Day, held on April 24th. Since rain was in the picture, a lot of work took place inside, as we continued the effort to declutter the church. We've worked hard on emptying the basement, cleaning it, and getting tenants to label or removed items stored there. We filled a rental dumpster for the second month in a row! We'll need more help on the next work day, Saturday, May 29th, from 9:30am to 12:00pm. We'll be gardening, weather permitting!

Financial Summary as of March 31, 2021

Contributions are above the budgeted amount due to several members paying their annual pledge in full in March. Parking lot income is less than expected, but hopefully we will fully rent the parking lots for the fall semester. Our building expenses are much less than budgeted; however, costs will increase significantly as the building will need a deep-cleaning before re-opening later this year.
