### A Letter From Rev. Sandlin

Hello, PCoC family!

You know, it's difficult to know how each of us will think about 2020 several years from now, but I do know I will recall that, even in our mandated separation, our spiritual community lived into its sense of connection. It's a beautiful thing to see.

From weekly phone calls, to the Outreach Team's steady efforts in the community, to all of our care providers who helped ensure the most vulnerable in our community were cared for, it has been a vision of what a healthy community looks like and how it functions. Having previously served as your Interim Minister, I cannot tell you how proud I am of us all!

I bring all of this up because, particularly with the news that the vaccines are working against even the newer variations, I imagine it won't be long until we begin gathering again inside the building. ### **Resource Committee report**

• Financial report: Income exceeded anticipation. have paid 2020 pledge to Presbytery.

### Strategic Plan Items:

• Building Options Decision Workplan. Don commented on items highlighted in the text:

#### **OLD BUSINESS**

- Building Closure: We will meet outdoors as of 16 May and may decide on returning to indoor meetings soon. Consensus decision: do one more month of outdoor services but then let COVID team make recommendations for procedures needed to reopen the building.
  - Actions needed to do a safe outdoors worship service were reviewed.
- Becoming a Hunger Action Congregation: Charlie has joined the Community Task Force on Hunger, and the Outreach Committee will talk about this issue at its May meeting.

### **COMMITTEE REPORT**

**Spiritual Formation:** the Sunday Study Group has finished *The Last Week*.

**Building & Grounds:** The A/C has had the highest number of maintenance requests. Grass is being cut every other week; a lot of the grounds work being done by Clara.

**Interior:** Decluttering the church: Barbara shared a spreadsheet indicating what work has been done.

**Outreach:** The committee has met to discuss future plans. The Happy Meals Fund has now received a total of \$1,145 and Ann will buy gift cards and distribute to Health and Human Services for use by social workers.

**Personnel: Janet.** Congregational Care Report from Jane Cauthen was presented; 15 contacts with members and attendees (visits and phone calls); also calls and contacts by other providers. Mark, Kate, and Jane sent an E-mail to our Calling Tree volunteers thanking them for keeping our congregation connected during the Pandemic and the closing of our services and other programs. We encouraged them to stay in touch with those on their lists, and to let us know of any needs. This project has indicated the dedicated, caring members of our Covenant community. 
# Farrell Scholarship News
