A Letter From Rev. Sandlin

Dear PCoC family,

Resource Committee report

We prefer that groups meet for one hour, but they may meet up to 90 minutes.

COMMITTEE REPORT

Spiritual Formation: Growth of the Church: The Session is working on this, with Janet, Lem, Ruth, Nancy, and Mark doing so under the aegis of the Spiritual Formation Committee.

Building & Grounds: Work on downstairs women's bathroom still ongoing, also working on an A/C leak. Many of the individual HVAC need replacement, a major expense. Mowing is being done every other week.

Interior

Decluttering the church: Barbara said the group is nearing the end of the major projects, and got a lot done during last workday. All Session members present expressed their amazement at the amount that the group has done and gave the group thanks for its work.

Communications: Have had some people join the church Meetup group.

Fellowship: We discussed holding a Fellowship Lunch outdoors in September.

Outreach: We delivered a check for \$1,145 to grateful staff at the DSS, who will use the money for Happy Meal gift cards for social workers who need to feed young clients. Joyce Powers presented a 4-page list compiling all the groups and organizations that church members are supporting on their own.

Personnel: Congregational Care report for June 2021: 12 contacts with members and attendees via visits and phone calls; 4 of our regular Providers made 19 contacts (visits and phone calls). Many among us, including Mark Sandlin, have been responsive to the needs of the Oakleys. Our thanks to Ruth Metheny, who designed a Meal Train page to provide meals and funds. Please keep Chuck and Annie in your thoughts.

Pennies for Hunger Campaign to Begin!

In our continuing efforts to focus on hunger issues in our community and around the world, the Outreach Committee will begin taking up an offering for the Presbyterian Food Program by asking for contributions to "Pennies for Hunger". We will have a basket on the table in the back of the Sanctuary for donations every second Sunday of the month (in August, that's the 8th and the 27th). While pennies are appreciated, we will gladly accept paper money and even checks!

Alleviating hunger and eliminating its causes is at the core of our lives as people of faith. There are deep injustices in our food system that we are called on to address. The root—or systemic causes—of hunger are poverty, exploitation, social and political marginalization, and structures that reinforce these historic injustices. To address the root causes of hunger, power and wealth must be shared, so that all are fed and can live fully. The committee hopes to expand our program and participate more fully with the Presbyterian Mission Agency during this year's Food Week of Action in October.
