## Session Meeting Minutes, September 14, 2021

#### Resource Committee report

• Financial report: Parking sticker sales robust. Resource Committee has sent Stewardship Campaign letter this week, with an October 18 deadline for return of pledge cards. Working on 2022 budget, which will reflect 12 months open rather than 6 months open/6 months closed, as in 2020.

#### Strategic Plan Items:

Building Options Decision Workplan: The Session met regarding a Plan. Janet found a consultant, Dr. Pamela Palmer, who has worked with churches. An Oct. 9th meeting is planned. The Session will hold a planning meeting before then .

#### **OLD BUSINESS**

• Reviewed re-opening plans: COVID is still rampant, so no plans to fully re-open yet. Beginning Oct. 3<sup>rd</sup>, The Fellowship Committee plans to serve wrapped snacks/drinks outside the Mendenhall door after Sunday services.

• Elder Nominating Committee update: Now have a list of names for the committee.

#### **COMMITTEE REPORTS**

Worship: No change to worship format. We're adding new Wi-Fi router in Sanctuary to improve livestreams.

**Spiritual Formation:** The next book will be Karen Armstrong's "12 Steps to a More Compassionate Life." On Oct. 3rd the class will have a special guest lecture by Jim Fisher, who will discuss research on Near Death Experiences.

**Building & Grounds:** Strategic Plan 2021 Workplan sent to Session members, with highlights of recent work on the buildings. Current rental procedures are going to be reviewed by the Resource and the Buildings/ Grounds Committees and Kate. A recovery group has received approval to reduce their monthly rent due to declining membership and use of the facility.

**Interior:** Decluttering the church report sent to Session members. List items nearly all done; Kate is getting a junk dealer to clean out the basement and stage areas.

**Communications:** Working with Kate to distribute Mission and values statements to all church members. She suggested we hire a webmaster to keep our website up to date. Committee will come back to Session when has identified best person/company to do this.

**Outreach:** We have begun support for Mustard Seed Community Health. As part of the Hunger Action Congregation process, PCoC members will work at the Out of The Garden Project on Sept. 17<sup>th</sup>. Ann thanked Mark for allowing time at the end of the Sunday service for announcements. We have a group formed to participate in the Oct. 3<sup>rd</sup> CROP Hunger Walk.

**Personnel:** Committee has official documents to be updated and annual reviews due, so will meet with Fred Wallace to get his help on this. Congregational Care for August included 29 contacts with members, attendees (visits, phone calls, two funerals and a funeral home visit). August saw the unexpected loss of member Tara Brown, which was a grief experience for members and staff.
