## Session Meeting Minutes, May 10, 2022

#### **OLD BUSINESS**

Building Open/COVID Review: June Session meeting will be in person with masking.

#### Covid task force recommendations to the Session were approved:

\*resume Wednesday night dinners per the Fellowship and Outreach Committees

**Homeless persons policy:** A draft policy was discussed; Task Force will present revisions in two months.

#### **NEW BUSINESS**

Mark will soon present a detailed report on his Sabbatical; the time off was needed for reflection on how best to serve the congregation and prevent burn out. He is also working on a book of Progressive Christian prayers.

#### **COMMITTEE REPORTS**

**Resource Committee:** contributions are up, as is the gas bill.

Worship: The committee will meet soon to discuss issues dormant during the shutdown.

**Spiritual Formation:** The Sunday Study group is still reading "Life Lessons" by Kubler-Ross and Kessler.

**Grounds:** Michael Thompson is mowing, and parking lot re-painting continues.

**Communications:** Survey results available to the congregation in the June newsletter.

**Fellowship:** Not ready for Wednesday night suppers yet; when they resume, the Committee cannot handle them by itself.

Outreach: Seeking community partners to help with the June FaithAction registration drive.

**Personnel:** Sexton position still open. Staff evaluations are ongoing.

Congregational care report for April: 13 providers served 10 members, attendees, with visits, phone calls. As of May 1<sup>st</sup>, Fred Wallace took over as coordinator.

## Results of PCoC Congregational Building Survey

The following results are based on 30 returned surveys. 4 respondents occasionally attend or listen online; all others attend often or are members.

Top two "Yes" votes:

- 1. 88% are for selling the building with the agreement for PCoC to rent space.
- 2. 79% are for gifting the church to a non-profit with the agreement we rent space.

Top two "No" votes:

- 1. 75% are against selling the building and buying another facility
- 2. 75% are against merging with another church at another location

More/Less likely votes:

- 1. 12 people will stay if we move, but 6 are less likely to stay
- 2. 12 people will stay if there is a merge; 8 are less likely to stay; 1 commented that they will stay only if we remain in the church building.

#### SYNOPSIS OF COMMENTARIES:

Worst case scenario: Building sale & rent another facility; 1 thought it would lessen the stress. Best case scenario: Sell the building & rent space in it, although that ability was questioned. Selling the building & purchasing another facility was considered unfeasible by all but 2. Gifting the church to a non-profit that allows PCoC to rent space was a good second option; 1 considered it risky.

Merging with another church in another location or in our current location raised issues regarding Progressive versus Traditional, potentially changing our identity. 1 thought it might give new energy & help with expenses, if compatible. 1 would stay only if we remain Progressive. 1 asked if we would continue to nurture & support each other.

Most doubted the feasibility of PCoC increasing revenue or continuing minimal maintenance. 2 suggested part-time staff/minister.

In general, a full congregational meeting was suggested for brainstorming, considering new ideas, & learning distribution of funds from building sale. The highest priorities were to keep the congregation together & to stay in the building.
