Session Meeting Minutes, August 9, 2022

Special Report by David Kolosieke; asked Session members to give their responses to 3 points: The objective of the Revisioning committee; the authority under which it operates; and what will constitute success. Responses will be summarized for future distribution, saying it's extremely important that all Session members give consistent answers to these points when asked by others, and that the process by which we arrive at our decisions be regarded as fair by all parties.

OLD BUSINESS: Building Open/COVID Review: Current guidelines remain in effect.

NEW BUSINESS

Discussion that Congregational Meetings be held regularly to update the congregation on how the Session plans to move forward; meetings will be held when there is a significant update to the revisioning process, so that there will be congregational buy-in to the process.

Vote on Director of Music: Worship, Resource, and Personnel committees have approved hiring Stephanie Lindley as Music Director, beginning August 2022. Session approved.

Signs on Campus discussion: re signage on our campus. Mark said there's no formal sign policy, but signs must be approved by the office. The Communications Committee will follow up.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

Resource Committee: Contributions are up; parking sales are up; natural gas charges are up, and HVAC repairs are still needed. Two Farrell Scholarships were awarded.

Banking resolution: In order for the church to accept short term loans to cover professional fees for the revisioning process, members signed a prepared Session resolution necessary to take on this debt and set up the necessary account.

Spiritual Formation: The Study Group is reading Amy-Jill Levine's "Sermon on the Mount." **Building & Grounds:** Don presented a building update. Michael Thompson is mowing. Tara's memorial garden will be dedicated in the near future.

Interior: Work day activities noted. A plaque was put on the grand piano. Superior Janitorial service has been doing an outstanding job.

Communications: The Meetup site hasn't produced new members. Ruth circulated a sign-up sheet for Session members to give devotionals at the beginning of meetings.

Fellowship: An Ice Cream Social was held Aug. 28^{th;} the Stewardship Luncheon is scheduled for Wednesday, September 28th at 5:30pm in the Fellowship Hall.

Outreach: Rev. Frank Dew of the Presbytery met with Session and encouraged members and the church to work on tackling the causes of hunger in addition to doing hands-on activities, such as the Out of the Garden Project. The Committee is collecting school supplies for Foust School and food/ personal items for the UNCG Spartan Open Pantry.

Personnel: The committee discussed the Music Director position. Staff evaluations are underway.
