Session Meeting Minutes, January 10, 2023

OLD BUSINESS

Revisioning Update: No new developments on Revisioning, waiting for responses to the RFP from interested parties. The due date is the end of January, 2023.

NEW BUSINESS

Sharing Session minutes with past Session members. Scribe has sent past Session members (from classes of 2020, 2021) copies of the monthly Session minutes. We discussed ending that practice.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

Resource Committee: Nancy shared the revised Budget, which includes a proposed tenant rent increase, to increase revenue and decrease financial losses. The new budget, which the Resource Committee recommends, includes a 3% increase in rents for the next several years, effective 01 April. We discussed whether increase was similar to rent increases charged in other parts of the city, and how to raise revenue more generally. Mark challenged all members to bring ideas to the next Session meeting on how to raise additional revenue in future, with budget revision to include these ideas.

Spiritual Formation: Sunday Study Group has just started the book, *Living the Questions*, about Progressive Christianity.

Buildings and Grounds: Mark asked for names of persons who could serve as liaison to work being done on the buildings. **Interior**: Need liaison for this area, too.

Communications: The Committee approved wording of an ad designed to reach other potential building purchasers, which will be released if more proposals are needed.

Fellowship: will bring in a plan at end of February for Fellowship projects.

Outreach: The December newsletter had a great writeup by Nancy on 2022 Committee activities. The January committee meeting will plan for 2023.

Personnel: Committee did Kate's evaluation.

Congregational Care: Fred reported there were 10 providers and 37 contacts for December.
