#### OLD BUSINESS

**Revisioning Update:** We have signed a letter of intent with Flywheel, so that the onus is on them to do what they have said they will do. Nancy has put together a statement that we have no conflicts of interest with their procedures, and will submit to the Session, on an ongoing basis, documents about the efforts made by both parties, so that they will be part of the record. We also need to get a new appraisal of the property.

#### **COMMITTEE REPORTS**

**Resource Committee**: Nancy presented a two-month summary report.

**Worship**: Brief discussion about whether to resume the monthly celebration of Communion; the committee will meet in a couple weeks to ponder this question.

**Spiritual Formation**: The Sunday Study Group has finished *Living the Questions* and will soon announce a new study book.

**Buildings and Grounds**: The Sanctuary doors have been repaired after numerous break-ins; room 210 is ready to rent and 211 is almost ready. With help from Mark Cable, we think we have solved a pesky water leak problem. Michael has already started mowing the grounds.

**Communications**: The committee is discussing issues related to livestreaming the comments held after the service is over and broadcasting has ended.

**Fellowship**: The committee has chosen 4 Sundays for Congregational luncheons: 26 March, 02 July (Ken Conrad memorial lunch), 27 August (Ice cream social), and Sept/Oct Stewardship luncheon.

**Outreach**: Work with the Out of the Garden Project continues every Friday; also continuing is our monthly Pennies for Hunger drive. In March, we held an Hour of Sharing fundraising drive, and in April or May, we will raise funds sufficient to purchase livestock or other materials for needy families.


