OLD BUSINESS

Revisioning Update: We have an official LOI (letter of intent) from Flywheel; details are being negotiated. We have gotten a new appraisal in order to receive a "Brokers Purchase Opinion" that will be used as part of the sale negotiations.

Stewardship luncheon: Luncheon will be on Sunday, October 15th following the 11:00am service. Presentations are being planned.

NEW BUSINESS:

Prospective member report: We have a possible new member.

Presbytery meeting report: Main news was the closing of one church, and "dismissal" of another, which is leaving PCUSA over differences regarding LBGTQ acceptance.

Changing Session meeting day: Tuesday night no longer convenient for Mark, who asked if the Session would be willing to change to Wednesdays. This will be on the October meeting agenda.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

Resource Committee: The committee is working on the 2024budget, given the upcoming changes to our circumstances; will ask committees to submit their proposals to his committee by 15 October. Finances are doing OK, with much loss of parking lot income and much expense for building repairs leading to deficit spending again.

Spiritual Formation: Sunday Study Group (Zoom) still reading Taylor's "Holy Envy".

Buildings and Grounds: Mark Cable made emergency repairs to HVAC in the Fellowship Hal. **Grounds**: Special Friday morning work days are taking place to groom the grounds prior to the September 30th "Remembrance Project" regarding the 1887 lynching that took place.

Interior: Preservation Committee working to on recommendations regarding what objects in the buildings to keep, store, donate.

Communications: New flyers are completed.

Fellowship: Planning meal for the Stewardship Luncheon; congregation will be asked to contribute desserts. Planning for a memorial service in October.

Outreach: Committee is busy with: Out of the Garden Project, aid to Vandalia Presbyterian, school supplies delivered to Foust School, CROP walk on October 8th (4 members in team so far). Margaret Foley has agreed to be our representative on the board of UKIRK. Also working on joining Adopt a School program, and will be part of Habitat for Humanity dedication.
