OLD BUSINESS

Revisioning Update/Building Sale: Committee awaiting response to revised Letter of Intent from prospective purchaser.

Elder Nominating Committee: A committee is in place, expect to complete the process in early February.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

Resource Committee: 2023 summary reviewed; about as expected. Reserves continue to dwindle!

Spiritual Formation: Sunday Study group continues to meet on Zoom and is reading *The Bible with and without Jesus*

Buildings and Grounds: Working on balancing heat issues between the buildings; Mark Cable working on repairs to-do list. **Grounds:** Leaf collection complete. The next work day is on February 3rd.

Interior: Thanks to Charlie Finch and Jeff White for taking down the window boxes. The Preservation Committee is about to begin working on an inventory of church property to identify what items to keep and what to dispose of.

Fellowship: First congregation meal of the year was on Sunday, January 21st. Plans are underway for February and March lunches, and for Easter. Working on congregation communications plans once we leave this location.

Outreach: We delivered 2 truckloads of donations to the new SOP site on the UNCG campus and toured the impressive facilities. Still collecting grocery bags for the Vandalia Presbyterian food kitchen. We volunteer monthly at the Out of the Garden Project. We held a letter writing campaign at the January congregational luncheon to write congresspeople regarding support for food projects.

Congregational Care: In December, 7 providers made 76 contacts.
