## Session Meeting Minutes, February 13, 2024

#### **NEW BUSINESS:**

Committee Leadership Review: Margaret has agreed to head the Personnel Committee.

#### **OLD BUSINESS:**

Revisioning Update: One of the 4 groups that sent the original LOI, Beauwright, has said it cannot be part of the process for this year, so a search is on for a

replacement investor. The Committee is working on several possible replacements, but this means that the beginning of the reconstruction process will probably be pushed back several months. The other groups are still interested, and Flywheel is still helping with this process also.

#### **COMMITTEE REPORTS:**

Resource Committee: Income is down, as expected.

**Spiritual Formation:** The Sunday Morning Study Group is reading Neale Donald Walsch's Tomorrow's God. The group meets on Zoom so all are invited to participate. **Buildings and Grounds:** Mark Cable ordered a part to fix the heating system, but

this may not solve the continual problem of overheating of some buildings.

**Grounds:** We're preparing for the mowing season and working on the grounds.

Interior: The Preservation Committee is on hold due to the uncertainty about when we'll need to

**Fellowship:** Monthly congregational lunches continue.

Outreach: The letter-writing campaign regarding legislation for stopping hunger was a tremendous success, due to Nancy's good work in designing the letters and cards and in providing clear instructions. The letters were mailed in February. A congregational survey is taking place to form ideas for other outreach projects. Ongoing projects continue (Vandalia's food pantry and the Out of the Garden Project). We will provide Habitat for Humanity luncheons for dates in May and September of this year.

**Congregational Care report:** In January, 7 providers made 63 contacts.

The monthly Presbytery meeting was attended by Mark via Zoom. There were no big votes, but he thought the important part was the beginning of the leadership by Tony De La Rosa, an openly gay man, as General Presbyter. His leadership and work has been so outstanding that even conservative members of the Presbytery voted to welcome him during the search process.

The installation of Class of 2026 Session members Margaret Foley and Barbara North will take place during the Sunday service soon.
