Session Meeting Minutes, April 10, 2024

NEW BUSINESS:

New Members: Two prospective new members were present and shared with the Session their spiritual journeys and why they wished to join PCoC. Beth Latour and Chrystal Culbreth were unanimously accepted by the Session as members. They were publicly welcomed by the congregation on April 28th.

OLD BUSINESS

Revisioning Update/offer on buildings: Still working on two options for selling the buildings. Flywheel is still leading Option A and will have meetings with interested developers soon. Option B interested party has scheduled building tour in May.

Locking Up Buildings: Nancy has been responsible for locking up the buildings after services for years. Now Session members will take turns carrying out this responsibility using a provided step-by -step guide and schedule.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

Resource Committee: The Committee presented the Session with a revised budget based on being in the building the whole year. The Session opted to delay a vote on new budget until next Session meeting, after members have had time to study the proposal.

Spiritual Formation: Zoom Group continues Walsch's Tomorrow's God.

Buildings and Grounds: Water leak reported on has mysteriously stopped (just as it mysteriously started); this has happened before. Elevator has had issues and was repaired.

Grounds: Michael is mowing every week. He completed Tara's garden at no cost to the church. **Interior**: No current needs; when we get a move date, will begin to plan procedures.

Communications: Mark still trying to find someone to lead this committee.

Fellowship: Schedule for Fellowship Luncheons was distributed.

Outreach: Pennies for Hunger raised more than \$156; Presbytery said it has given \$33K to local food banks, including Vandalia Presbyterian; will study Heifer catalog to decide what animals to donate; May will be Habitat luncheon; SOP will send a speaker in the fall to talk to the congregation about that project.

Personnel: No updates from Fred on contacts. Staff meetings ongoing.

This creative process helps people discover their unique talents and challenges, and to access their own wisdom to answer life's questions. 
May is Concerts Month! May 3rd: The Tannahill Weavers

Coming to PCoC, one night only! Friday, May 3rd at 7:00pm, The world-famous Tannahill Weavers. Born of a session in Paisley, Scotland, and named for the town's historic weaving industry and local poet laureate Robert Tannahill, the Tannahill Weavers have made an international name for their special brand of Celtic music, blending the beauty of traditional melodies with the power of modern rhythms. As one of the world's premier traditional Celtic bands, their diverse repertoire spans the centuries with fire-driven instrumentals, topical songs, original ballads and lullabies, and humorous tales of life in Scotland. In 2021, piper and fiddle player Iain MacGillivray, Scotland's youngest Clan leader, joined the band; he's worked on exciting projects such as Outlander and Men in Kilts. The band 's variety and range of their materials is matched by their enthusiasm and lively Celtic spirits.



May 17th: The Claude Bolling Concert: Bolling's Greatest Hits!

Live and in person, on Friday, May 17th, 7:30pm at PCoC, The Greensboro Bolling Ensemble presents 13 pieces by the legendary Claude Bolling. The ensemble is: Stephanie Lindley (piano), Brian Blauch (flute), Gavin Douglas (guitar), James Armstrong (trumpet), Paul Foster (bass), and Pete Dennis (drums). They are among Greensboro's most highly skilled, professional, popular, and accomplished musicians and have been working together for more than a year to offer a concert of Claude Bolling's crazy classical/jazz "crossover" music. This music took the world by storm 50 years ago, topping the classic Billboard Music charts for more than 10 straight years, from the early 1970's into the mid-1980's. Bolling wrote film scores for dozens of Hollywood movies in the 1970s and 1980s, including the film "California Suite". Most recently, his solo piano piece, "Temptation Rag", was featured in the film "The



Joker", with Joaquin Phoenix. Don't miss this exciting musical event! Tickets are available at the door.
