A Letter from Reverend Sandlin

Christmas. A child born in a manger, no crib for his head. Sent into this world to teach us something about the value of every human soul - sent in as the least-of-these, born to a poor woman in a borrowed animal stall - sent to teach us that "the least-of-these" is simply a human construct created by the insiders to define themselves over and against people they see as somehow less than themselves - sent to show us what a life looks like when it starts from the assumption that all people are worthy of love.

That is not just a better story than the one now told, it's downright rebellious. So, this Christmas I wish for you and for me a rebellious little Christmas.

A Christmas that encourages us to be advocates for those caught in the traps of hunger, homelessness, oppression, poverty, and war. Traps that are created by the powerful but mostly impact those who struggle. I wish for us a rebellious little Christmas that also encourages us to see that we too have difficult spaces in our lives. A Christmas that helps us see beyond the cleaned-up Christmas story of the present to the humble, unassuming, rebellious beginnings of Christianity – a baby born to an outsider – a baby who would teach the world about love, justice, equality, and compassion.

May your Christmas be full of love, justice, equality, compassion...and a little bit of rebelling against the Powers that Be! Merry Christmas!

Session Meeting Minutes, November 13th, 2024

The official Session meeting was postponed until the regularly-scheduled December meeting, due to the passing of Rev. Sandlin's father. The other Session members still gathered for an informational meeting with a Salem Presbytery representative to hear information on navigating this transitional period at PCoC.

Financial News

The Church of the Covenant was very fortunate to receive an anonymous gift of \$25,000 in support of our work as a progressive, Christian church. This money will give us more time to find a suitable buyer for our property. This gift adds to other contributions to total \$145,830 through October 31st . Rent income totals \$65,300. Total income for 10 months totals \$216,050.

Our expenses total \$220,415 for a net loss of \$4,365. Expenses include \$96,835 for personnel, \$95,020 for building and grounds, \$11,890 for the music program, \$3,400 for outreach, \$7,415 for administrative expenses, and \$3,910 for worship, fellowship and other.


